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A. SERVICE RATE SCHEDULE

APPLICABILITY

Applicable in entire service area to water service for culinary and domestic purposes at one point of delivery for use at a single dwelling unit.

RATE

No maximum	\$19.00 minimum <u>monthly</u> charge for each service connection (Partial months are not prorated).	(N)

Water is not metered. Customers have agreed to minimize usage by (1) Using water primarily for culinary use, and (2) avoiding wasteful practices.

New SERVICE CONNECTION FEE

One time charge for each service line installation, to be paid in full before water service is provided. (For the accounting of the company, revenues received from this charge will be treated as contributions towards plant.)	\$400.00	(N)
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OTHER CHARGES

1. Returned check	\$ 5.00	(N)
2. Account transfer charge, where a new customer becomes responsible for paying the bills for an existing service connection and there is not an interruption in service.	\$ 10.00	(N)
3. Reconnect fee for an existing service line where service was been terminated for at least one month (i.e. has not been continuous). Examples of reasons for termination would be; a) to avoid paying monthly charges in the winter, b) vacancies between owners or tenants, or c) nonpayment of bills. This fee includes an account transfer charge.	\$100.00	(N)

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B. Condition of Service

1. Service Connections: Permission shall be obtained from the Company before any service connection can be made to any part of the waterworks system or before any work can be performed upon old or new connections. No unauthorized person shall tap any water main or distribution pipe of the Company or insert therein any corporation stop, or any other fixture or appliance or alter or disturb any service pipe, corporation stop, curb stop, gate valve, hydrant, water meter or any other part of the waterworks system or attachment thereto. No person shall, without first obtaining a permit from the Company, connect or disconnect any service pipe to or from the mains or distribution pipes of said waterworks system nor to or from any other service pipe now or hereafter connected with said system; nor make any repairs to, additions to, or alterations of any such service pipe, tap, stop cock, or any other fixture or attachment connected with any such service pipe. (N)

2. Service Line and Use Restrictions: All service line materials and installation shall be provided by the applicant. Installation shall be inspected and approved by the Company before the service line trench is backfilled. All new hookups shall provide a shut-off valve on the service line near the connection to the water system. This is in addition to the valve that is the property of the water company. The owner or occupant of any building or premises entitled to the use of water from the Company shall not supply water to any other building or premises without written permission of the Company. (N)

3. Service Initiation and Termination: Service may be turned off by the Company when so requested by the applicant or when the applicant fails to abide by these regulations, including but not limited to failure to timely pay for service provided. Whenever the water is terminated at any premises, it shall be reinstated again only upon payment in full of the applicable reconnection fee shown in the rate schedule and any past due amounts and

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| 4. Reconnect fee where service line had to be physically disconnected because of unauthorized turning on of service by the customer. In addition, the customer will be charged the monthly charge for the period of time unauthorized service was received. | \$150.00 | (N) |
| 5. Seasonal turn-on and turn off's by company for those customers who remain as customers and pay the monthly fee year round but want their water turned off to prevent freezing in the winter. | \$ 25.00 | (N) |
| 6. Interest on past due bills | 1 1/2 % per month applied to amounts over 30 days delinquent. | (N) |

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required service deposits due from the customer. (N)

4. Seasonal turn-on and turn-off's: Customers are encouraged to have a shut-off valve on the service line near the connection to the water system for seasonal turn-ons and turn-offs. In existing situations where existing service lines do not have such a valve the customer may use the valve that belongs to the Company but the customer is responsible for any damage as explained in section B. 6. (N)

5. Disruption Liability: The Company shall use reasonable diligence to provide continuous water service to its customers, and shall make a reasonable effort to furnish them with a clean, pure supply of water, but the Company shall not be held liable for damages to any water user by reason of any stoppage or interruption of his water supply caused by scarcity of water; accidents to works; temporary interruptions for alterations, additions or repairs; acts of God; the acts of the customer; or other unavoidable causes. (N)

6. Damage to Facilities: Costs of any damages to the water system, including damages to the company valve at the service connection, that is caused by the actions of the customer shall be assessed against the customer. (N)

7. Billing and Payments: Bills covering the charges shall be rendered quarterly and shall be due fifteen days 15 days after being rendered. If any customer neglects or refuses to pay the water service bill or any other obligation due to Company within 30 days from the billing date of said bill, the account shall be considered delinquent and shall be governed by section 6 of the Utah Residential Utility Service Regulations. (N)

8. Regulated Usage: Whenever the Company shall determine that the amount of water available to its distribution system has diminished to such a volume that, unless restricted, the public health, safety and general welfare is likely to be endangered, it may prescribe rules and regulations

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to conserve the water supply during such emergency, Such rules and regulations may include, but shall not be limited to, the restriction of certain hours (or total prohibition) of the use of water for outdoor watering. Since the water is not metered it is important that all customers minimize usage by avoiding wasteful practices. Wasteful practices include but are not limited to; 1) not timely repairing leaks in customers service line and plumbing, 2) irrigating of lawns and gardens. Limited outdoor watering is allowed under the following policies:

- a) Permanent year round residents shall water during the weekdays.
- b) Non-permanent residents, i.e. weekend, seasonal, etc., shall water on the weekends.

9. Changes and Amendments: The right is reserved to amend or add to these Rules and Regulations as experience may show it to be necessary or where such amendments or additions are added to section R750-200 of the Utah Residential Utility Service Regulations, or where such amendments or additions are approved by the Public Service Commission of Utah.

C. Facility Extension Policy

1. Definition: An extension is any continuation of, or branch from, the nearest available existing line of the Company, including any increase of capacity of an existing line to meet the customer's requirements.

2. Costs: The total cost of extensions, including engineering, labor, and materials, shall be paid by the applicants. Where more than one applicant is involved in the extension, the costs shall be prorated on the basis of the street frontage distances involved or upon such other basis as may be mutually agreed by the applicants. Sufficient valves and fire hydrants must be included with every installation.

3. Construction Standards: Minimum standards of

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the Company shall be met, which standards shall also comply with the standards of the Utah State Bureau of Environmental Health. Pipe sizes shall be designated by the Company, but the size shall never be smaller than 4 inches in diameter. The pipeline shall be installed only along dedicated streets and highways. (N)

4. Water Storage and Supply: All costs for providing existing water supply and storage shall be paid by the Company. This cost shall include the maintenance and operation of pumps as required for operation of the system.

5. Ownership: Completed facilities shall be owned, operated, and maintained by the Company.

6. Temporary Service: The customer will pay the total cost for the installation and removal of any extension for service to a venture of a temporary or speculative nature. Such costs will be estimated and paid before work is begun on the extension.
